

1. **John Pugh** dob app 1780 and Mary Field- COI- Town of Galway. They have 2 children:

Honor (1803-1815?)

Martin (1804-?)

There is an Honor Pue who died in Mayo in 1815, no other information-assuming it is this Honor.

2. **Andrew Pew** and Mary Laffe (1796-1878) RC- one daughter Anne, RC, baptized at St Nicholas Combined, N&E Parish, Galway City in 1835.

He was a nailor per Mary's death record. She died in the Ballinrobe WH, Mayo, about 22 km north of Headford. Possible uncle to the Phews below? The name Andrew is also found in the Phews of Mayo.

The **Phews** have land in Ballyfruit, Kilkilvery, Galway- Ballyfruit is in the Electoral Division of <u>Headford</u>, close to the Mayo border Records confirm they are related to the Phews in Mayo, sibling to priests Michael, Martin, Andrew and William. RC

- 3. **John Phew** 1822-1887 **and Mary Walsh-**married in Castlegar, County Galway 1855. Address 2 Ditch. John died 1877 leaving everything to Mary, widow. Address Ballyfruit, Galway. All of their children were born in Donaghpatrick, Galway.
- 1856 <u>Anne</u> Phew There is an Anne Phew who died in 1877-age 20- a farmer's daughter, address <u>Ballyfruit</u>, <u>Galway</u>. Micheal Phew present-could be brother or uncle.
- 1857 <u>Catherine</u> Phew -possibly married a Fallon, buried in San Mateo County, California 1917. Baptism sponsor is Bridget Fallon.
- 1859 <u>James J. Phew/Pugh 1859 m Mary Williams in California in 1889</u>. Immigrated in 1880. Died in 1925.
- 1861 Michael Phew/Pugh 1861 -married Anne Gilroy in California 1891-naturalized in 1888, died in 1904
- 1864 Martin Phew-1864-1878 address Ballyfruit, registration district Tuam
- 1866 Nora/Honora and Andrew-twins. Nora married a Sullivan and lived in California. She died in 1940.
- 1866 <u>Andrew Phew living with his mother Mary in Moyne, Shrule 1901 Mayo Census, lives in house 2.</u> James Phew, mother Nellie and sister Annie is on the same census in house 8 (*see Mayo Phew Time Line*) giving more proof that Galway and Mayo Phews are related. Andrew later married Mary Agnes Ward at Chapel of Shrule in 1905, they had a son Joseph in 1910 died age 14- they are all buried in the Moyne Cemetery in County Mayo.

James, Micheal, Catherine and Honor immigrated to California.

Headstone in Holy Cross Catholic Cemetery in Colma, California with the name of James Pugh 1925, Harry **Biggens** 1932, Kate **Fallon** 1917, Anne **Flynn** and Honora (Nora) **Sullivan**. Thomas (uncle) also named Kate **Fallon** and Anne **Flynn** in his will. His sister Bridget was married to a **Flynn**, Anne is possibly her daughter.

His niece Bridget married Patrick **Biggins**, his sister Bridget married a **Flynn**, probably married to a **Sullivan** first. There were several witnesses/sponsors with the name of **Fallon**. Most likely all related but difficult to know how.

- 6. <u>Michael Phew</u> two records, one is 1822-1897 the other 1823-1898, died in Headford, Patrick Flynn was present at death. Has to be related to the Mayo/Galway Phews- there was a Michael Phew who was a sponsor for James Phew 1859, son of John and Mary. Cousin?
- 7. Patrick Phew b app 1832 in Galway, age 19 -in the 1851 Chelsea Pensioners military record.
- 8. Bridget Pugh (married) 1907-1940 Claddagh Quay, Galway unknown

Leitrim

Robert Pue and Mary McSharry were in Leitrim for a while before going to Sligo, where Robert died in 1899. Originally started in Mayo- m in Kilmore, Kinnlough (diocese of Leitrim and Sligo) in 1846.

Also in Roscommon. See Crossmolina Tree.

Hugh Pue/Pew (1813-1876) and Mary Feely (1817-1881). He was a farmer in Tawley and was RC. They had the following children:

Bridget Pue 1854-1868, Kinlough Parish.

<u>Jane Pugh</u>/Peugh/Pheugh 1856-1933. Living in <u>Tullahan</u> working as a servant for the Dickson family in 1901 and 1911. Death records have address as <u>Tawley</u>. Tawley is about a 5 hour walk to Sligo. Jane was present when Hugh died.

<u>Margaret</u> 1858-1888, died in the <u>Ballyshannon</u> WH. She was present at her mother Mary's death.

There is an <u>Alice Pew</u> dob app 1850 who had Martin in 1871-address Tawley, apparently not married. RC. Another daughter?

Kinlough was about 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours walk from Tawley

3 **William Pue** and Mary Wright/Right. Married in 1852, Kinlough Parish. They have a daughter <u>Mary</u> in 1859. RC


They are also found in Sligo records, Ahamlish Parish. Marg b in 1853 and Michael in 1856.

Possibly another brother to John and Hugh.

There is a William who was in prison for Drunkenness in 1880, b 1824, living in Sligo, address Barracks Street. Born in Curderry County Leitrim. I suspect William is a soldier.

Margaret 1858-1888, died in the Ballyshannon WH. Patrick Pugh died that year as well, on the same recordsparents George Pugh and Sarah Daly of Donegal. Died two days apart. Unable to establish a connection. Cousins?



Five couples identified.



Crossover to both Crossmolina Tree and EC tree.

There is a George Lloyd Pugh born 1837 who was a soldier.

There is at least a generation missing from the Elphin census until the next records starting with John Pew/Pue. His address was Ballina-just south of the Sligo border. I suspect he is a grandchild of Bartley. Also had Hugh Pew as a witness. Strong naming pattern.

John Pew/Pue -dob abt 1786 m Joanne Woods in 1816 in Ahamlish. They had the following children:

Bartholomew * 1814-1894 m Bridget Moffett 1849 in Ahamlish Parish- he was a weaver and a farmer

Margaret 1817 b in Ahamlish

Patrick* b abt 1820 m Mary Costello bef 1835 farmer in Lissadill

Anne* 1821-1873. Martin Pugh, probably son of Patrick, was present when she died. Assuming she is Martin's aunt.

John Pue 1822 and Bridget Nicholson information based off the records of their sons, James and Patrick b 1856

Hugh? Name found as witness for John and Joanna also for Brigitta daughter of Barth and Bridget 1816-1865 dob app 1800

*With the exception of Margaret and John- list of children is hypothetical- based on dates of birth and location- and Bartholomew would be prior to marriage.

Also a foundling named Daniel Pew born 1810 in the Drumcliffe Parish. No denomination.

Bartholomew Pugh/Pew and Bridget Moffett raised family in Aghaghad/Grange, baptized in Drumcliff and Magherow, Sligo RC, Diocese of Elphin. They had the following children:

Wool-working was a historic industy in Ireland. Exportation of Irish wool was more important for a long time over manufactured cloth. esteemed in the 13th and 14th century particularly for Holland. It gained attention of Britain and Charles I prohibited export of wool to any country other than England and Wales. Other laws and incentives to import linen instead brought the industry down as well as the Jacobite Wars, but started in increase again in the 1800's, but not to the extent that it once was.

Ireland: Industrial and Agricultural. (1902). Ireland: Browne and Nolan, limited.

Weaving and spinning helped farming families supplement their incomes, the women did the spinning and the men traditionally did the weaving.

Patrick Pugh (1820-1885) and Maria Costello Some Ancestry trees say he came from Galway-unable to find documentation to support that- no records found for birth or marriage.

They had the following children:

Mary dob abt 1837- m Michael Connor -present at father's death. No records for her birth, only marriage, based on children's birth records. James (1838-1894) m Joanna Callaghan 1865 after moving to San Fran Calif. Buried in Holy Cross Cemetery, same as Phew family of Galway. Owen (1845-1903) new family member-sent by owner of Roslyn Koppenol tree, who provided marriage and birth records. Owen he moved to Brisbane, Australia and married Anne Staunton in 1885.

John (1847-1889) m Bridget Higgens m 1872, farmer in Lissadill

Sara (1852-?)

Elizabeth (1855-1857) married Thomas Larkin in Calif

Winifred (1855-1934) -moved to Calif m Thomas Joseph Hennessey in 1893 and John W Ashby abt 1898.



Hugh Pugh (1851-1882) shoemaker died in the Sligo WH, address Ballentrema? Rossinver East. Son?

Patrick Pugh (1848-1878) weaver died in the Sligo WH, no address. Another son?

Both men died in the workhouse and there is the weaver connection

Prison Record for Henry Oliver, Army Reserve, 28, shamrock tattoed on his left hand, born in Sligo, lived on Holborn street, laborer, RC, assaulted **Mary Pugh** and was drunk on the public street 1896. Two calendar months hard labor for assault and an extra week(?) concurrent with? Mary T?, daughter of Bartholomew.

Also assaulted an officer. In Petty Sessions in 1898 for assaulting a man. Also drunk 1899, committing larceny, in drunk in 1900. There was another Henry Oliver that died in 1895, a yr before his trouble started. In 1903 he is a soldier, brother Tom. Remanded/military escort. 1906, drunk, assault. 1904 Riotous and indecent behavior. 1905 Married to Maggie (Margaret Devany 1904?), threatened not to work at work house. 1905 Drunk and incapable. 1906 Assaulted his wife Maggie. 3 months hard labor. 1906 Drunk and incapable. 1907 Drunk and incapable. 1907 Assaulting his wife at the workhouse. 1908 Drunk and incapable. 1909 Drunk and incapable. 1910 Drunk and incapable. 1911 He lived on Barracks street, widower with daughter Mary 3.

1913 Drunk and incapable. 1914 Drunk Died in 1938? Found no reason why he should assault Mary Pugh.
