The Abbey	<i>what is this? An actual Abbey or land or hotel? Ask researcher in Donegal- what townland would this be and would it be connected to land that John and Thomas had? Most likely the town of Donegal.</i>
<b>Early Petty Sessions with Pue families who have addresses at The Abbey, Ballyshannon, Cloghan, Rathmore, Rosstown and Townparks</b>	
There was an Anne, Catherine, Bridget, John, Robert and William at the Abbey, about the same time.	
	<p><b>Anne</b> 1837  <b>Catherine</b> 1832 (assuming she is from the Abbey)  <b>Bridget</b> 1828-1832 <b>There are death records for Bridget 1810-1864 Address Abbey</b>  <b>John</b> 1828-1866 -he had a wife, what was her name? One of the above?  <b>Robert</b> 1837-1864 seemed to be more of a trouble maker than the rest  <b>William</b> 1829-1876 <b>dob app 1810-1820, married to Mary death records (1821-1876 ) have her married to William, a cottier at the Abbey. He is still alive in and at the Abbey in 1876- not on Griffiths?</b> He also has a son William.</p> <p><b>Land Records:</b>  John <b>Pugh</b> and Thomas <b>Pugh</b> in Griffiths-Townparks, Parish of Kilbarron.  <i>Where is the Abbey on Griffiths?</i> He shows up before William. No William, Robert or Micheal on Griffiths  Based on the accusations below, it appears John was a land owner, he owed wages and land, accused of throwing down the walls of a house and owed poor rate taxes. His wife was accused of unjust weights while selling goods.</p>
1837 <b>Anne Pue</b>	<b>Anne Pue</b> accused William McCowley of the Abbey of assault-McCowley ordered to keeping the peace
1832 <b>Catherine Pue</b>	<b>Catherine Pue</b> accused Cath, Rebecca and Jane Conolly of assault-no address. Pat Grimes, John McGomigle, Denis McIntire, Chas Carmichael witnesses-no address, but probably lived at the Abbey based on year and spelling, and the witnesses who are affiliated with the Abbey
1828 <b>Bridget Pue</b>	<b>Bridget Pue</b> "The Abbey" vs Ed Daley of Ballyshannon- no wages If this was Bridget 1810-1864 she would be 18 years
1828-1832 <b>Bridget Pue</b>	Mary Currin accused <b>Biddy Pew</b> and Catherine McCormigle of assault Address Abbey "settled" John McKeon and Wm Conolly. Must be witnesses.
April 24 1828 <b>John</b>	John Pue Assault- John McCowley of Kistenaugh (Location appears to be in the country outside of Donegal) no appearance- <b>no address</b> -probably John address Abbey based on year and spelling
Aug 9 and 16 1828 <b>John</b>	<b>John Pew</b> of the Abbey -defendant with James and John McMomigal for wages to Edward McCool and James Clarke of Carhelade-Owed wages
June? 1832 <b>John</b>	Bernard Grimes vs John Drum/Assault- <b>John Pue</b> and ? Dennien witnesses. No address but most likely Abbey based on spelling, year and names involved.

June 10 1845 <b>John</b>	Patrick Gallagher complainant of Corkar <b>John Pue</b> of the Abbey defendant. Non payment of wages-non appearance
Oct 1847 <b>John</b>	Edward Kelly, collector of Poor rates for the Ballyshannon Union vs <b>John Pue</b> Non-payment of the poor rate 4/6 Pd No address but must be the same as above in 1837
12 Dec 1848 <b>John</b>	Ezekial Tydd, inspector of weights and measures, Letterkenny vs <b>John Pue</b> of the Abbey Having on the 9 <sup>th</sup> of Dec Inst at Ballyshannon in the possession of your wife where <u>goods were kept and exposed for sale</u> , certain unjust weights. To pay the summons and forfeit the weights.
1866 <b>John</b>	<b>John Pue</b> of the Abbey Witness Ellen Fox vs James McIntire, SR, James McIntire son, and Paul McIntire, all of the Abbey. Threatening to take his life the first opportunity either in public or private and challenging him to fight on the 2 <sup>nd</sup> Inst at the Abbey. Dismissed
March 1829 <b>William</b>	<b>William Pue</b> summoned "to give evidence" -probably William address Abbey based on year and spelling
July 18 1832 <b>William</b>	<b>William Pue</b> accused John Ormsby Assault- Owen Kirnagan and Thomas Edwards witness. -probably William address Abbey based on year and spelling
July 1835 <b>William- possibly younger William?</b>	Andrew Early Senior accused Pat Gillvary, Pat Cassidy, James Cassidy, Michael Cassidy, John Fortin, Pat Dermott, Owen Daly, Pat Cleary, Philip McCart, John Rogan, John Rogers, Pat Melly, Con McNulty, Dan Gilvary and Michael Gilvary. Teagean Melly, Dan Melly, John Melly, James Melly, Michael Melly, <b>William Pue</b> and Michael McNulty. Entering on his premises by night and cutting and forcibly carrying away a quantity of ? his property-probably William address Abbey based on year and spelling
Feb 1837 <b>William Pue</b>	<b>William Pue</b> Abbey summoned "to give evidence" in the case of Constabulary A. Green assault-discharged?
Feb 1844 <b>William Pue</b>	John and James McGonnigle and <b>William Pue</b> of the Abbey Kitty Roper, Owen Connor, Richard Davis all of Ballyshannon Illegally pulling the black rack and carrying it away from the shore at Danby that they have rented from Sam Crawford Esq. Witness Pt McGonnigle. - <i>William seems to have a connection with Sam Crawford</i>

1838 <b>Robert Pue</b>	Witness Pat Black James Black Ballyshannon vs Bryan Green and <b>Robert Pue</b> Abbey Assault on the night of the 16 <sup>th</sup> of Dec. <b>Committed to Jail for one month</b>
Jan 1853 <b>Robert Pue</b>	John Koen of the Abbey Witnesses <b>Robert Pue</b> and Thady Carmichael of the Abbey vs Persons unknown On the night of the 22nd or morning of 23rd January 1853 at the Abbey in the county of Donegal wantonly and maliciously did cut the bar off a house the property of complainant. Information taken by Simon Sheil, Esquire.

Oct 17 1848 <b>Robert Pue</b>	John Coleman of Ballyshannon vs <b>Robert Pue</b> of Ballyshannon Stealing a quantity of potatoes his property on the 15 <sup>th</sup> inst at Cooleolly <i>Robert above was at the Abbey, but address could be Ballyshannon</i>
17 Mar 1887 <b>Thomas Pugh</b>	<b>Thomas Pugh</b> of Ballyshannon vs James Stirson/Steuson of Ballyshannon Unlawfully refused to pay comp the sum of £1-9.10 balance of a larger sum due for wages for printing. No app.
26 Aug 1869 <b>probably William<sup>2</sup></b>	<b>John Ward vs William</b> Pew of <u>Ballyshannon</u> , James Kelm of Ballyshannon and James Boyle of Rowantreehill On the 20 <sup>th</sup> day of July 1869 at Darby in said county, unlawfully did rescue a cow seized for county cess.

May 21, 1849 - <b>Robert</b>	Jas Jones, Master of the Schooner, Rhinard (?) vs <b>Robert Pue</b> of the Cloghan Having a piece of a warpe rope in his possession on the 21 <sup>st</sup> of May Inst. At Ballyshannon which was feloniously stolen from the Schooner Rhinard on the morning of said day when in the Port of Ballyshannon. Witnesses James Jones, John Mertell, John Gillespie. (?) taken for next sessions-Pue come for trial.
1 Mar 1877 <b>William</b> <b>1?</b>	John Muldoon of Doobally <b>William</b> Pugh of Cloghan- died the next year? Petitions bill for the sum of 3/5 due for ? sold and delivered. Decreed 2/6 and costs.
<b><u>Kittynangle.</u></b>	
19 Feb 1864 <b>Robert Pew</b>	Geo Doherty and Thomas Doherty of Glassboley, Drumholme- Laborers John Timony of Roscath, Thomas McShee of Ardeclon, John Boofan, Kittynangle, <b>Robert Pew of <u>Kittynangle.</u></b> Laborers. Bidy McNulty of Ballymagroty? spinster, all of the Parish of Drumholm and John Friel of Cashel, laborer, Parish of Kilbaron Being of a party who did unlawfully waylay, assault and beat complainants at Ballymagroty? On the night of 3 Feb 1864. No appearance( <i>Drumholm is a parish next to Kilbaron- Kittynangle Beg and KittynangleMor are townlands of Drumholm, as is Glassbolie and Ballymagroty, which is the closest spelling I could find as it was hard to read</i> ).  There was also a complaint from John Timony on the same night that the Doherty brothers challenged the complainant to a fight and assaulted him without provocation at Ballymagroty the same night.
<b>Rathmore</b>	
26 Aug 1869- <b>son of</b> <b>William<sup>2?</sup></b>	Bridget Smith of Rathmore <b>Michael</b> Pue of <u>Rathmore</u> On the 6 <sup>th</sup> day of Aug 1869 at Rathmore in said county unlawfully did enter the dwelling house of complainant, assault her and use threatening language toward her, putting her in fear and terror of her life. Sum not served.
<b><u>Rossnowlagh</u></b>	
27 Nov 1873 - <b>son of</b> <b>William<sup>2?</sup></b>	Constable James McCleary of Ballyshannon <b>Robert</b> Pugh of <u>Rossnowlagh</u> On the 15 <sup>th</sup> day of Nov 1873 at Ballyshannon in said county unlawfully were in a state of intoxication upon the public street. Fined 2/1 and costs.

1862 <b>George and Sally Pue</b>	Mary Kerrigan of Arofarna(?) vs <b>George Pue and Sally Pue</b> of <b>Drumachrin</b> . On the 30 <sup>th</sup> day of March 1861 at Drumachrin in said county unlawfully did assault complainant and use threats towards her. No appearance.
April 1862 <b>George Pugh</b>	Mary Kerrigan of Arofarna vs <b>George Pue</b> of <b>Drumachrin</b> ? bill for the sum of £ 1.5.3, £ 1 of which is due for balance of larger sum of 30/-due for the use of three feather beds and 5/3 being due for the value of feathers taken out of said beds by defendant (?) for his own use. The defendant to pay 1£ and costs.

28 May 1874 <b>George Pugh</b>	James McBreartz of <b>Bundoran</b> vs <b>George Pugh</b> of <b>Bundoran</b> On the 11 <sup>th</sup> day of May 1874 at Bundoran in said county unlawfully waylay and assault complainant and press him to commit a theft on one John Johnston of Bundoran. Fined ten shillings and costs or one week imprisonment.
1829 <b>Michael Pue</b>	Complainant <b>Michael Pue</b> - defendant Patrick Gilvary-no wages-worker- <b>no address</b> - not William's son- this is a new Michael, DOB about 1800-possibly brother to George? Also the name Gilvary is found in Drumacrin and Finner
Aug 1850 <b>Michael<sup>1</sup></b>	<b>Micheal Pue</b> of Finner vs Anne McTiernan of Finner Assaulting him with stones on the 12 <sup>th</sup> Inst at Finner. No appearance.
